## § 1 Qualification profile

- (1) The Summer School Eastern Europe teaches the fundamentals of various disciplines in the humanities and social science disciplines, such as literature and cultural studies, linguistics, history, musicology or political science. The thematic focus is on Eastern Europe in general and Ukraine in particular, on Austria and its cultural, historical, political or economic interrelations with Eastern Europe and Ukraine as well as on European cultural and intellectual traditions.
- (2) The purpose of the Summer School Eastern Europe is to improve language skills in the respective target language, especially in the area of speaking, and to expand intercultural competences.

## § 2 Scope, duration and structure

The Summer School Eastern Europe covers 4 semester hours and 5 ECTS-Credits. One ECTS-Credit covers a workload of 25 hours.

#### § 3 Acceptance and admission

- (3) Admission to the Summer School Eastern Europe requires a general higher education entrance qualification or a foreign equivalent as well as active studies at a recognised post-secondary educational institution.
- (4) Admission to the Summer College for Eastern Europe is decided by the Director of the Summer College for Eastern Europe on the basis of the participants' academic and linguistic aptitude.
- (5) Persons who have been accepted to the Summer School Eastern Europe and have paid the course fee will be admitted as extraordinary students by the Rectorate of the University of Innsbruck.

# § 4 Language

The Summer School Eastern Europe is multilingual: The Compulsory Module Summer College Eastern Europe is held in Ukrainian, Russian, English and German, the Elective Modules Command of Language primarily in the respective target language.

## § 5 Types of courses

Courses with continuous performance evaluation:

- (1) Practical courses (UE) focus on the practical treatment of concrete scientific tasks as well as on practising specific competences. Maximum number of students per course: 10
- (2) Courses with integrated practical parts (VU) focus on the practical treatment of concrete scientific tasks that are discussed during the lecture parts of the course. Maximum number of students per course: 20

- (3) The course instructors of the Summer School Eastern Europe have to inform the students in a suitable fashion about the objectives, form, content and methods used in their courses as well as about the content, form, methods, dates, assessment criteria and standards for the examinations.

## § 8 Final certificate

After successful completion, the graduates of the Summer School Eastern Europe will get a final certificate.
