

Carmen Mellado Blanco (University of Santiago de Compostela)

Carmen Mellado Blanco is Professor of German Philology at the University of Santiago de Compostela. Since 2007, she has coordinated the research group FRASESPAL, within which she has organised numerous international seminars and conferences, e.g. *EUROPHRAS 2019 Productive Patterns in Phraseology*.

She has led several competitive projects on Contrastive Phraseology and Construction Grammar, the most recent of which is *CONSTRIDIOMS, Construction Grammar and Phraseology: German and Spanish Constructional Idioms in Contrast through Corpora* (PID2019-108783RB-I00). She is currently a member of the Managing Committee of the European project *A Multilingual Repository of Phraseme Constructions in Central and Eastern European Languages* (COST Action CA22115), funded by the European Cooperation in Science and Technology, and is also the coordinator of the Theory and Typology working group.

Her research areas include Construction Grammar, Contrastive Phraseology, Lexicography and corpus linguistics, and she has published nearly two hundred works. These include the bilingual dictionary *Idiomatik Deutsch-Spanisch* (2013) and the volume *Productive Patterns in Phraseology and Construction Grammar* (2022).

Since 2020 she has been co-director of the international journal *Yearbook of Phraseology* (De Gruyter), and since 2022 she has been a full member of the scientific network *The dynamics of prepositions and prepositional constructions in Spanish*, funded by the German Research Foundation within the University of Tübingen.

Pedro Ivorra Ordines is an Alexander von Humboldt Fellow at KU Eichstätt-Ingolstadt (Germany). He has also held a one-year Margarita Salas Postdoctoral position at Universidade de Santiago de Compostela (Spain). He is currently a working member the research projects *Construction Grammar and Phraseology. German and Spanish Constructional Idioms through Corpora* (funded by the Spanish Ministry of Innovation and Science and led by Carmen Mellado Blanco) and *A Multilingual Repository of Phraseme Constructions in Central and Eastern European Languages* (PhraConRep) (funded by the European Cooperation in Science & Technology (COST) and led by Katrin Schlund and Vladimir Karabalić). Besides, since 2022 he has been a full member of the scientific network *The dynamics of prepositions and prepositional constructions in Spanish*, funded by the German Research Foundation within the University of Tübingen. His main research interest revolves around the intersection of Phraseology and Construction Grammar, and linguistic creativity is a major topic of his ongoing research.
