Dagmar Divjak (University of Birmingham)

Dagmar Divjak is a Professor of Cognitive Linguistics and Language Cognition at the University of Birmingham. She obtained her PhD in 2004 at the KULeuven in Belgium. She was a postdoc at UNC-Chapel Hill in the US and at Stockholms Universitet in Sweden before taking up a position as Lecturer (Assistant Professor) at The University of Sheffield, UK. She was promoted to Full Professor in 2018. In 2019, she transferred her research team to the University of Birmingham, where she leads Out of our Minds [https://outofourminds.bham.ac.uk], an interdisciplinary group of linguists, psychologists and computer scientists. The groups uses computational algorithms that mimic how humans learn to develop new ways of describing language and to transform how we learn and teach foreign languages. She has published widely and is currently (outgoing) Editor-in-Chief of the journal Cognitive Linguistics, which she has led since 2018.
