Linda Prossliner (University of Innsbruck)

Linda Prossliner is a postdoctoral researcher at the department of Translation studies at the University of Innsbruck. Her research focuses on cognitive linguistics, phraseography (Italian-German) and applied linguistics (legal language, comprehensibility research). She studied general linguistics (Bachelor's, Master's and doctoral programme) at the University of Innsbruck. During the years of her doctoral studies, she also had a collaboration with the Austrian Ministry of Justice, which sponsored her research on the comprehensibility of legal texts and for whom she worked as a lecturer of legal texts, optimising their comprehensibility. She also created a style guide for making Austrian legal texts more comprehensible, which has been sent to the Austrian Ministry of Justice for educational purposes. Starting from December 2022, she is working as a postdoctoral researcher at the department of translation studies of the University of Innsbruck. Her research project focuses on the creation of a bilingual phraseological dictionary model Italian-German for children aged 7-11 with a cognitive component. Furthermore, Linda Prossliner is part of Prof. Laura Giacomini's research team and helps working on the entries in the *Phrase-based Active* Dictionary (PAD), an electronic linguistic resource for foreign language learners currently being developed for the languages German, Italian and English. Linda Prossliner is also an author and writes fantasy children's books in the languages German, Italian and English.
